7429. 1638 Letter from "Coozen Simon Thelwall" to acquaint Lord Bridge-
12 Jan. -water about the money for Armes for the Musters at Ruthin. Armes
were difficult to get and the money was taken up to London and
deposited with Auditor Wyn, until they were reddey. He came down
to the Country and died, and some difficulty appears to have
arisen; Lord Bridgewater had sent to the Earle of Newport, Master
of the Ordnance, for a supply from the Tower, but he had re-
quired a Privy Seale for their delivery. H
7430. 1638 Copy Letter from Jo: Risam, Mayor of Tenby, to the Deputy
6 Feb. Lieutenants of Pembroke, reporting the arrival at Tenby of a
Scottish barque with 3 men on board, who declined to take the
Oath of Allegiance to the King or to answer Interrogatories, say-
ing that they had sworne to the late Scottish Covenante & that
he had caused them to be stayed until he could be advised. H

7433. 1640 Draft Circular Letter from Lord Bridgewater to his Deputy
21 July Lieutenants in Hereford, Monmouth, Brecknock, Glamorgan, Radnor,
Carmarthen and Pembroke enforcing obedience to a Royal Mandate
as to the employment of the Earl of Worcester in some particular
service and quoting from the Royal letter:- "The better therefore
to inhale him to performe this service our pleasure is that
imediately you send to y^r Deputy Lieutenants and other officers
of the Counties of Hereford, Monmouth, Brecon, Glamorgan, Radnor,
Carmarthen and Pembroke, that they be ayding assisting obeying &
furthering to the said Earle for y^e execucon of our Commands,
whensoeuer hee by himselfe or his officers shall haue cause to
produce anie Commission from vs. And to the end that in such case
it may not be thought strange nor o^r officers surprised wee
require you not to omitt to geue them present notice of this o^r
pleasure togeather with a strict charge to performe therein wth
diligence and care what shall be required from you for o^r service"
